Young SC&T is an opportunity for young people aged approximately 10-12 years old to develop and explore their skills in traditional music, learning from experienced tutors and making music together.

The course offers an intensive week of classes in fiddle, whistle, guitar and other instruments and song with locally based tutors who can guide the young musicians to continue to extend their skills after the school.

The lead tutors are

- Hazel Thomson - whistle & song lead
- Colin Black - guitar lead
- Laura Lockyer - fiddle lead

Other skills available in the team include recorder, piano/keyboard, percussion, clarinet and banjo. Music influences from the Scottish traditions, classical and jazz.

Location & Accommodation

Instrument

The young person should already be able to play some simple tunes on an instrument. During the week he/she will have the opportunity to try out a new instrument.

Timetable

The classes will run from 10.30am to 3.00pm each day.

- 12:30 Lunch break
- 13:00 Second instrument
- 14.00 Group work

Fees

The course fee is £30 per child for the week. For families with a low income, application should be made to the SC&T office for a reduced or waived fee.
